We are responsible for keeping you **safe** from abuse and neglect.

Safeguarding is making sure you are **safe** from abuse and neglect, and you can make **choices**.



Abuse is when someone hurts you or treats you badly. Abuse is wrong. There are different types of abuse.



Neglect is when people who are supposed to help you don't look after you properly.

<u>For example</u>, not giving you enough food or not keeping you warm and safe.







Our staff are **checked** before they start working and across the time they work with us.



Our staff have **training** to make sure they have the right **skills** and understand safeguarding.



Our staff will **report** situations of **concern** to the Department of Child Protection, when needed.



What is <u>adult</u> safeguarding?



We support the safety and wellbeing of adults with a disability.




We understand and follow the South Australian Charter of the Rights and Freedoms of Vulnerable Adults.

We support the safety and wellbeing of children and young people with a disability.



We **understand** and follow the Charter of Rights for Children and Young People.



We can provide **information** to make sure you know your rights.

We also use these Rights for children and young people in **other** out of home care arrangements.



Where do I get help?
